


V. God's Design For Marital Union


A Biblical & Theological View of Sexual Relationships in the Christian Marriage

Introductory Concerns

- Victorian approach to union in marriage: Sex is sin! It's a nasty subject, dirty topic. Don't talk about it.
- Postmodern liberated view: Sex is the highest of human relationships. It is what makes a good marriage.

A. The Biblical View

- 2. <u>Sex is not the basis of marriage, and</u> <u>marriage is not a sexual relationship</u>.
 - Sex is a very important part of marriage.
 - Not to participate wholeheartedly, aggressively and passionately is sin against God, spouse and self.
 - But sex does not equal marriage, John 4:17-18.
 - Unity in marriage is much more than sex.
 - Marriage success is more than sexual success.

3. <u>Sex has as a primary goal of satisfying</u> <u>your mate</u>.

- 1 Corinthians 7:3
- The goal is not getting pleasure, not having a climax, not necessarily to conceive children...it is providing joy to your spouse.
- Retrain your thinking from getting pleasure to giving pleasure.

A. The Biblical View

- 4. <u>God created both the husband and wife</u> with equal ability to satisfy each other.
 - 1 Corinthians 7:4
 - No one has sole power or authority. You do not have this independent of your spouse.
 - Both should be aggressive.
 - Sexual relationships are to be equal and reciprocal.
 - Ecclesiastes 9:9!

A. The Biblical View

- 5. <u>Pleasure in sex is not sinful and forbidden</u> but it is assured and encouraged.
 - Proverbs 5:18, 19
 - Satisfying your spouse is to be a deeply satisfying experience for you.
 - We are to be "ravished" or "intoxicated" (i.e. exhilarated) by them (Prov. 5:19).

6. <u>Sexual relationships should be</u> regular and continuous.

- 1 Corinthians 7:5
- Four guidelines in not having sex:
 - a. Mutual agreement
 - b. Agreed upon time
 - c. Fasting and prayer
 - d. Terminate and start again
